Job Placement

Job placement works closely with students to prepare them for entry into the job field. Students receive a work readiness evaluation as they near completion of the program. This allows job placement to help student evaluate any barriers that may impede a student's entry into the workforces.

Summit Academy assists students in obtaining employment through assistance in resume building, completing online applications, faxing and locating employment opportunities.

Job placement also focuses on job retention. They maintain ongoing contact with students and employers after placement. This helps to support student success and build strong relationships with employers. They will follow students up to one year.
